How can a painting be lost? In his talk "*Mistaken, Forgotten, Revived: A Painting's Journey*," Dr. Peter L. Doebler, Kettering Curator of Asian Art at the Dayton Art Institute, will explore the life of a monumental Korean screen painting. Part of the museum collection since 1941, it was progressively marginalized only to recently receive new life through fresh research and extensive conservation.
